Patti McAndrew showed the new shirts and is taking orders. (Thank You Patti)

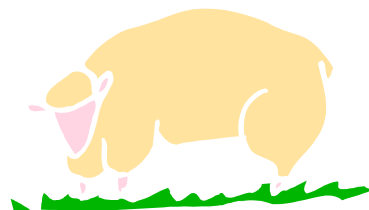
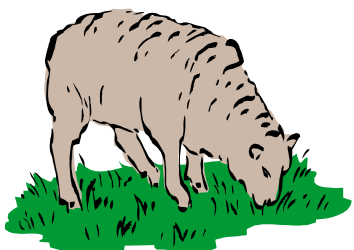
Judy Keske announced she has a person wanting raw alpaca fleece spun. Contact her if interested.

We are continuing to collect info about a mic for the meetings and demos.

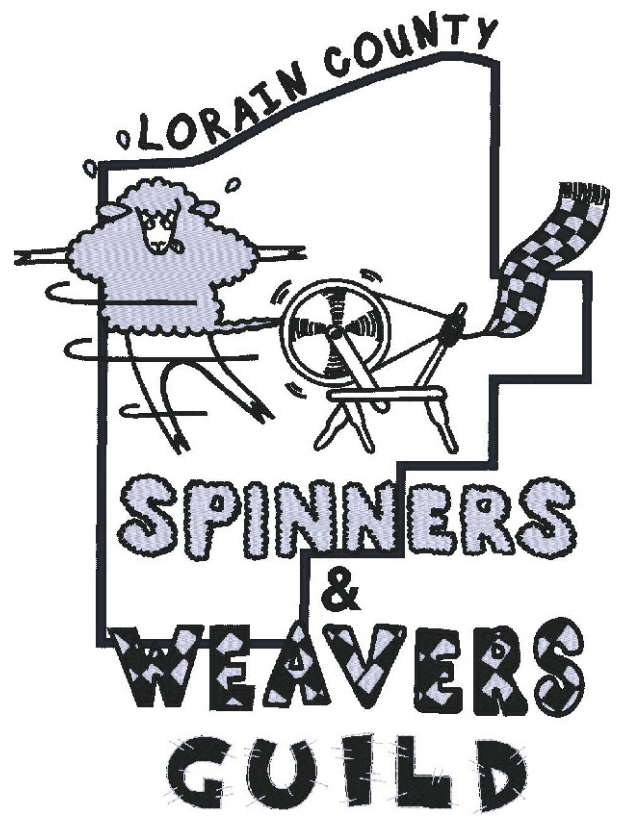
The program about caring for old fabrics and clothing was excellently done by Nancy Rosendaul. She gave several hand outs of instructions that will be very useful.

Guild Apparel & Bags for Members

The guild's logo artwork has been completed and it looks great. I will be present at the meeting this Tuesday, and at future meetings, to take orders and collect money for anyone wishing to purchase any of the guild items. These are good quality items. In the newsletter is an order form. Use it to fill out your order and bring it to the meeting. It has all the items listed with the sizes available along with the prices. Don't forget to figure in the 6.75% sales tax. I will need payment at the time the order is placed. I need a minimum of 12 items in order to submit an order to the printer. Please make your check payable to me, Patricia McAndrew. If you forget your order form, I will have some extras with me. I will also have color charts available at the meeting so you can choose the colors you desire.

The items available to members at this time are; short sleeve t-shirts, crewneck sweatshirts, hooded zippered sweatshirts and tote bags. The t-shirts are heavyweight 6.1-ounce, 100% cotton, preshrunk. The crewneck and full-zippered hooded sweatshirts are 9-ounce, 50/50 cotton/poly fleece, and have set-in sleeves. The deluxe canvas tote bags are 15-ounce cotton canvas, and have a size of 22" W x 16" H x 6" D. The guild logo will be applied to these items, excluding the tote bags, using a two-color screen printing of black and white, so keep this in mind when choosing your colors. The logo for the tote bags will be embroidered in black and white.

To keep our apparel looking good longer, the printer has suggested that we turn clothing inside out and wash in cold or warm water. He also suggests air drying, to keep the printed surface from cracking and peeling.
