While in Romania she learned different needle arts including Romanian Point Lace (RPL), needlepoint, cross-stitch, knitting, and crochet. Later in Baltimore she learned tatting as part of the Constellation Lace Group of MD and VA. She has designed RPL patterns and taught RPL to the Great Lake Lace Group in Michigan, the Keystone Lace Group in PA, the Constellation Lace Group, and at the Baltimore Art Studios. She will be speaking to us about Romanian Point Lace, which uses both crochet and a needle. Her work can be previewed at Ginko Gallery in Oberlin, where she has pieces for sale.

Rug Hooking Class at That'll Do Farm

Thursday, September 27, 2012, 10 a.m. - 3 p.m.

McGown-certified rug hooking teacher Katie Allman is coming to That'll Do Farm to teach a free-spirited, no rules type of rug hooking class in the style of Canadian Artist Deanne Fitzpatrick.

Katie has been hooking for the past 20 years and teaching in her Ashland, Ohio home and area guilds since 2006. Katie and her sister, Laura Fitch, own <u>Kidl-de-Divey Woolens</u>.

Students have their choice of two 12"x16" patterns: Poppies on the Edge of Town or Boat & Shacks.

Class fee is \$50 and includes instruction & color planning, your pattern on burlap, lunch and a talk/slide show by Katie on her rugs and her adventurous trip to Nova Scotia. Please bring your own frame, hook and scissors. Add \$15 if you would rather have a linen pattern.

Katie will bring some wool and various fiber packs for sale (\$10 each), in addition to other wool for your rug. Please feel free to bring any of your own wool you would like to use. A variety of wool strip cuts can be used, anywhere from a 3 to torn wool.

365 Knitting Clock

'365' is a knitting clock created by german designer siren elise wilhelmsen. according to wilhelmsen, time is a concept which unites us all, making it the lowest common denominator. on the one hand, time appears to be a as physical phenomenon, logical and easily divided into the past, present and future. on the other hand, time can be viewed very subjectively. how long a minute, an hour or a year takes can depend on how time is experienced in different situations. however, this does not alter the fact that a day has 24 hours, one hour has 60 minutes and one minute has 60 seconds.

'365' seeks to give a physical manifestation to the change of time. drawing from the change that is witnessed through the growth of human bodies and hair, the same concept is found in '365' which translates time through the growth of knitted material. the clock houses a circular knitting machine with 48 needles, a thread spool, a thread holder and roll of yarn. moving in clockwise direction, one day leads to a complete round, while a year gives users 2 meters of a complete scarf.
