

APRIL PROGRAM: Spinning Other Fibers

Our next meeting will be April 9th from 7 to 9 p.m. at the Carlyle Visitor Center. Nora Eason of the Medina Guild will demonstrate spinning silk from roving; flax roving and a strick of linen; angora fiber; and she will have recently attended a cotton spinning workshop taught by Joan Ruane. She will demonstrate for us as many fibers as she can so we can get an idea of the differences between spinning various fibers, and time allowing she may even spin a little cashmere. This is demo only. She will have a samples us to fondle, and will answer our questions.

Gluten-free Vanilla Cake with Sweet Pumpkin swirl (from Lynne at our March Meeting)

15 ounces canned pumpkin puree 14 ounces sweetened condensed milk 4 eggs, at room temperature 1 cup sugar 5 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice 1 15-ounce box gluten-free yellow cake mix 12 tablespoons (3/4 cup) unsalted butter, melted and cooled

1 cup chopped pecans or semi-sweet chocolate chips

Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Grease a 9x13 inch pan and set it aside.
- 2. In a medium-sized bowl, place the pumpkin, condensed milk, eggs, sugar and pumpkin pie spice, and beat until well combined.
- 3. Pour the pumpkin mixture into the prepared pan. Sprinkle $\frac{1}{3}$ of the dry cake mix over the top and swirl it into the wet ingredients with a knife.
- 4. Sprinkle the rest of the dry cake mix on top, and smooth carefully until it covers evenly. Pour the melted butter evenly on top of the cake. Next, sprinkle evenly with pecans or chips. Cover the top of the pan with foil.
- 5. Place the cake in the center of the preheated oven, and bake for 25 minutes.

Uncover and bake for another 15 to 25 minutes, or until it has begun to brown around edges.

6. Remove from the oven and allow to cool completely.
