

Our Vice President Karen Long, life-long dyer, spinner and weaver is recuperating well from her hip surgery. Since she was unable to participate in Mill Hollow's Pioneer Experience, I still had all my zinnias, coreopsis and marigolds I was saving. What's a dyer to do? So, with the help of Karen and Betsy Bruce I had my own dye day experience. A three day event! Twelve large pots on a roaring fire battling cool and windy weather (our home is named Windy Way). My husband kept us fueled with wood - and lots of it. I was able to use the flowers I saved all summer and a few other natural materials such as black walnuts, osage orange and pernambuco shavings. We dyed over 40 skeins of yarn in the most vivid natural colors.

If you want to learn about natural dyeing, Karen will be speaking and sharing her expertise at the Medina Guild meeting in April, 2018. And, hopefully Karen will be back on track for next year's Mill Hollow adventure which you can stop by and visit. Also, our library has numerous books on the subject of dyeing.

Fellow guild members, are you ready for a challenge? Our 2017 challenge will be a re-purpose or re-create challenge. Here are the guidelines:

- Take an old garment, blanket etc. and re-create something new!
- The old item can be from your closet or someone else's. It can also be from a second hand shop.
- Remake the piece into something new. If the old was a sweater you can make it into something new like a scarf, pair of socks, hat or even back into a sweater. If the old was a shirt, you can quilt it into something new. You may add other materials to your project like other yarn, fabric or bead items but at least 50% of the new project needs to come from the old.
- Take a photo of the old so members can compare it to your new. (need help with a photo, bring it to a guild meeting and someone can snap a photo for you)

Weekend Double Weave Workshop with studio time following Mon-Fri April 13-20, 2018

Learn to easily weave two layers of cloth on a 4-shaft loom in a variety of techniques: tube, side opening, center opening, double wide, pocket, stuffed or not and more. Weave a 9" wide sampler and then a wall hanging for your shuttles and other small weaving equipment in a weekend. This workshop is designed to help adv. beginner and intermediate weavers learn how a simple threading and tie-up makes weaving double weave a dream.
