

### JUNE PROGRAM

The June Program is Fleece from the ground up: How to pick out a good raw fleece, skirt it, clean it and process it. There will be presentations on 2 types of fleece: Columbia wool by Beth Hines & alpaca by Jean Crawford.


The Guild drum carder and blending board will be used to show processing techniques. Helpers are

welcome. Members are encouraged to bring in and show how they use carders, combs, flickers and whatever else you use to get your fiber ready to spin. Here is a chance to show what works best for you and pass on tips to other members. (And see if there's other equipment members would like the guild to get).

We will use this wool & alpaca fiber to practice processing and also some odds and ends to make Kitchen sink batts if there is time. Feel free to bring in wheels/drop spindles to test out the processed fiber.

This is a call out for any guild equipment (carders, wheels, etc.) that is currently borrowed. Please bring it in for use during this program.

# JUNE 2018 President Perspective

Our executive board and committee chairs met in May to discuss our successes and challenges as a guild. We had a great brainstorming meeting and came away with many ideas. You will hear about them in the next few months.

One agenda item we discussed is our service project. Thank you to everyone who helps spin and dye and weave our shawls. It is now time to sell tickets and to advertise our project and where the ticket sale proceeds will go. Did you know that we help numerous organizations on a yearly basis? In October, we help a food bank with our donations at dinner and then the guild's treasury helps round that number up. Last year we gave \$200 to the Second Harvest food bank in Lorain County. We also donated money to the "Adopt A Raptor" program for the Metro Parks. The Metro Park not only pays us to demonstrate at Mill Hollow, but allows us to use the Carlisle and Wellington Reservations free for our monthly meetings. Ginko Gallery gives us a large space to house our library, so we donate \$120 to help with the cat rescue program Liz provides. Lastly, we spend a large portion of our proceeds to an organization that fits our mission statement. The last three years we helped SEPA (Santa Elena Program of Accompaniment) and provided assistance to a weaving community in Guatemala.

At our June meeting, we will take suggestions for our larger donation. We can continue our SEPA donation; we can donate to the Heifer program like we did in the past; choose another program; or, a combination of programs. I AM ASKING YOU TO HELP OUT AND BRING SUGGESTIONS OR YOUR THOUGHTS TO OUR MEETING. If you have an organization in mind, please bring literature to inform our guild members of the organization and how it meets our guild's mission statement. We will have discussion and then vote in July. I am very proud to be part of an organization that has a service project to help others.
