Original wire heddles and reed

Solid iron ratchet and pawl for both the warp and cloth beams Counterbalance action with chain support of the shafts

Spring return action on the beater

Sectional warp beam

Large post and beam construction

Floor footprint approx. 4'x6'

The loom just needs some TLC and minor support bracing repair, but it's all around solid. No bench included, but the current owner has a basket with original rag shuttles to go with the loom.
