

Lots of fun things happening in the newsletter. Good luck to the weavers that entered a project in the fair contest.



Reports

President Barb reported on the unusual spring and summer and hopes everyone stays safe and continues to creat fiber projects. She thanked all who have donated supplies and/or created masks to help others. The officers and program committee have made the decision to meet via ZOOM until January 2021 and has scheduled the Carlisle Reservation Buckeye Room and Wellington Visitor Center for the 2021 year. Barb was sad to see the fair cancelled but thought it was the right decision. She knows that there were a lot of projects completed for the fair and during this summer. The program committee has come up with a great program idea for those members working hard at their craft. The program committee will share and clarify the upcoming "Fair Events" competition. Mill Hollows pioneer craftsman day has been canceled, but the park wants to produce a video highlighting all the different stations. 
Birds of a feather project (Peacock and hummingbird), just for the fun of it. Tapestry Weaving: 8 epi, cotton seine twine warp, wool weft.

Here is my log Cabin table runner. I used 8/2 Brassard cotton. 18 EPI





Entry #6

Wove a rag rug style covering for this beach chair. Used donated material and old sheets. The warp is 8/4 cotton rug yarn at 6 epi and the weft is 1 1/2 inch strips of fabric. Wove it on a Union 36. The yellow and orange summer for this summer beach chair.

Entry #7

Hand dyed wool, merino tencel, alpaca and boucle using natural dyes (marigolds, sandalwood, cochineal, and other plants from nature).
Throw is 24" x

80". Plain weave. Weft is boucle and wool.







ENTRY #8

A pair of scarves: stripes of hand-dyed 8/2 and 6/2 tencel (yes, silk wannabe), scarf on left has "sienna" weft while scarf on the right has "hunter" weft. Woven in extended twill pattern.



Kitchen towels - 8/4 Cotton. 12 epi - 8 harness pattern "pinwheel" - woven on my Wolf Pup

Plain weave towels.

ENTRY #11

I dyed the warp years ago, 'found' it in June, dyed some weft, then wove this shawl. 100% mohair, 12 epi, approximately 24" x 72" plus fringe.

(Example: Team 1: Gina gets inspired from the photo. Gina passes her creation to Jean O. Jean only sees Gina's project and gets inspired from that. Jean O. passes her project on to Missy. Missy only sees Jean's project and gets inspired......etc. etc.)

Save the project you received. All projects should be brought to the May 11, 2021 Potluck. They will then be on display at Ginko Gallery June, 2021. If you receive a skein of yarn - do not use it. Just get inspired by it and create your own project.
