

Great Lakes Fiber Show

I will express my thanks next month to everyone that have volunteered their time, to assist us with checking in attendee's and assisting in the classrooms, we could not do this without you.

Great Lakes Fiber Show Booth, Building 39 at the west end.

We have three booths spaces altogether, so we have more room too spread out, to sell and demo. I will be there Friday Afternoon to start setting up the booth. On Friday, you can drive up and unload. All items for sale need to have your name and price. I use a square I have your name in the machine I click on your name and enter the price. I then at the end of the day get totals. I will then send you a check, the following week when the customers checks and credit cards clear. This method has worked well for the past few years.
