



Discover Indigo Dyeing with Sandy Shelenberger

Indigo is an ancient dye that is used to create a traditional magical blue coloring. You will learn how to create patterns on fabric and scarves, which will then be dyed in an Indigo vat. Shibori is a Japanese word used to describe a variety resist technique such as binding, twisting, or clamping that create a variety of patterns. Learn the traditional methods of Shibori, then create your own patterns.
