President Perspective,

Hello all! Thank you for participating at our September 2021 meeting. Kudos to us for raising over \$500 for our service project through the basket raffle.

During our meeting there was conversation regarding demonstrations and the definition of what constitutes someone to be eligible for the scholarship drawing.

Our LOCO demonstrations have always been a time where guild members shared their expertise related to spinning, weaving or other fiber related arts by interacting with the community. Looms, wheels, knitting and crochet needles are brought and the demo begins. It has also been a time where members promote the guild, especially our service project by selling tickets and visiting with on-lookers. Our bylaws do not specify or define a demonstration, but the above has been our goal and supports our mission statement "to share our craft through demonstrations in our community".

Our demonstration committee chairs have a listing of past demonstrations which include events where guild members share their skills with others. Thus said, at this time, we need the meaning of demonstrations to focus on sharing our craft in the community. Examples would be Mill Hollow, specific demo days at the fairs, Birmingham, Lyme Village, Lake Ridge Academy, school visits or other events where we sell tickets or bring our equipment. There is a listing in our demonstration book of some of the annual events.

We can interpret "sharing our craft in the community" in a variety of ways such as our garden at Mill Hollow, judging events, helping other guilds, etc. But at this time, scholarship qualifications should adhere to the true spirit of demonstrations.

Future conversation can include how can we thank those who give over and beyond their time to our guild or times guild members represent LOCO in a non-interactive way.

It was pointed out to me our scope in the community has grown in recent years and because of events like extra participation the Lorain County Fair, the dye garden maintenance, representing LOCO at Wooster, and other similar functions, the definition has come into question. We have gained a number of members and sparked interest in the craft while out there doing general LOCO demonstrations and additional outreach volunteerism.


