



Many of their stories had not been shared before because no one had ever asked them. Sharing their stories with you helps the weavers feel that we care for them and their lives.

"Their faces are their story of struggle, survival, and perseverance," says Adopt-A-Native-Elder Founder Linda Myers. "Their hands hold the gentleness and softness of old age. Their rugs show the beauty within the weavers. It is a great honor to share the weavers' rugs and stories with you."

What is Roc Day? The story as I know it, is that traditionally it is the day after Epiphany, when the spinning wheels came back out and the spinners got back to work. The weavers got another week off, till there was enough yarn spun to keep them busy.

We celebrate this by getting together on the Saturday nearest to Epiphany. We spin, weave, knit, crochet, any craft you can transport. We also do a gift exchange by raffle. So please bring a small gift or several. They can be labeled: For a Spinner, Weaver, dyer, crocheter, Knitter, or anyone.

But while that does sound somewhat organized we do need to have some assistance, in handing out raffle tickets, setting up tables, setting up chairs, organizing possible games, or crafting areas.
