


Pioneer Experience & National Spinning Week

Monochromatic Stash Challenge

Dig through your stash and create a project to share in May, 2023. The catch is, it must use a monochromatic color scheme or black and white scheme.

Don't have enough colors of yarn in your stash? We can have a Stash and Grab Party at one of our guild meetings. Talk to other members and see if they have a color for you. Then barter with a color they may have. More information to follow regarding the yarn swap. Or spend some time dyeing yarn.



Monochromatic color refers to a color scheme that is comprised of variations of one color. You can use any color to create a monochromatic color scheme. For example, **adding white to red creates pink, adding black to red creates maroon**, etc. Then, you could have a monochromatic color scheme of pink, red, and maroon.

Majestic Meadows Alpaca Farm in Medina https://majesticmeadowsalpacas.com

The Guild did a couple demos at this farm a few years back. Last week, with out of town company, we stopped in. They have grown!!! It is now almost a petting zoo, with an alpaca product store. There is an entrance fee, but you can wander among 150 alpaca, a few llamas, and visit with little pigs, bunnies, mini donkeys, kangaroos, and one very large camel. The place is kept beautifully clean, and the animals are healthy, clean, and friendly.

I happened to meet up with one of the owners, and inquired about available fleeces. There were a few small bags of roving in the store, but not enough to really create anything. They send out their fleeces to make yarn for sale, but there are usually fleeces on hand. They just don't advertise it. I asked for black and they brought out 4 very clean and skirted fleeces for me to choose from. I thought it was very reasonable. I purchased a few.

I have not dealt with these folks, but I got a notice the other day they have fleeces available.

"We aren't members of the guild but as Tunis producers have raw wool available. We have wool in various grades that are available.

Prices for full fleece run from \$20-\$40 per fleece.
