She has worked with CERF+ to put together a great video series about neck & shoulder pain, sitting and standing for artists. She washed the dyed articles in the washer. Later she washed her husband's white socks that have the copper in them. The socks came out pink. She rewashed. Each time she washed them the copper must have worked as a mordant. The socks got more and more red. I thought it might make an interesting tidbit in the newsletter. Shall we try using copper socks next time we dye? "
