From Jean O.: New LOCO Library Book

Weaving Hand Towels Simply: 43 Designs for 4- and 8- Shaft Looms, Susan Kesler-Simpson.Stackpole Book, c2024

Hand towels are small in size and weave up quickly. This collection of patterns has 43 designs in a variety of weave structures from easy to advanced for both 4- and 8- shaft looms. However, it's the first part of the book that makes it so much more than another book of patterns. It has an introductory section explaining how to read and work from weaving drafts, the best fiber choices for towels, how to combine colors in pleasing combinations, finishing techniques and troubleshooting tips. It combines lucid explanations with clear drawings and pictures. Chapters include: Back to basics, Profile Drafts, Computer Programs, Fiber Choices, Color, Texture and Pattern, Hemming and Tips, Terms and Troubleshooting. I learned a new way to tie on that conserves thread and probably along with handy time saving tips I'd forgotten about.
